Polyvagal Theory Applied to Neurodivergent Clients

You'll learn the five-state model of polyvagal theory, including the activation and downregulation process, gas/brake pedal analogy, application to all mammals, an evolutionary perspective, how PTSD and CPSTD are stored in our body, and big picture of what nervous system healing looks like. You'll gain an understanding of the key nervous system differences for neurodivergent people, including increased risk for nervous system activation, executive dysfunction, interoception, alexithymia, and other mental health challenges. We will also cover chronic dysregulation patterns of neurodivergent clients, including Autistic meltdowns, overdrive/collapse, burnout, PTSD, CPSTD, Generalized Anxiety Disorder and depressive disorders. You'll learn how our modern-day life is disabling neurodivergent people and how you can support your clients with actionable solutions.
