Suicide Prevention

You'll learn about common traits and trends of the three neurodivergent populations who are at an increased risk for suicide, including ADHDers, Autistics, and Trans people. With this knowledge you'll also be better able to assess for unidentified ADHD and Autistic clients. We will cover suicide risk factors that are unique to each of the aforementioned populations, including substance abuse, social isolation, unemployment and discrimination. You'll learn a polyvagal theory perspective on suicide prevention, which will help you better understand and plan for safety issues. You'll gain important suicide assessment information and how to create safety plans that your client is motivated to use. We will finish with referral recommendations for clients who need a higher level of care, ADHD/ASD assessments, or another therapist when their needs are outside of your scope of practice.
